Interesting Paper and Plastics Recycling Statistics

- Paper is one of the most-often recycled materials, accounting for half of the materials collected for recycling by weight.
- More than 50 million tons of paper were recovered for recycling in 2021, achieving a 68% recycling rate.
- In 2021, 91.4% of corrugated cardboard was recycled.
- Almost half of the paper recycled in 2021 was used to make cardboard boxes. Keep reusing and recycling those Amazon boxes!
- Plastic recycling has long posed challenges. Unlike glass and metal, plastic cannot be repeatedly recycled without quickly degrading in quality.
- Every hour, 2.5 million plastic bottles are thrown away just in the U.S. The total bottle recycling rate for 2020 was 27.2%, down from 28.7% in 2019. Keep refilling and using those tumblers! Plastic bottles take upwards of 450 years to degrade.
- Between 75 and 199 million tons of plastic are currently in our oceans.

We are called to be good caretakers of the planet and all of God's creation. We can do that by choosing to reduce, reuse and recycle at work, at home and at church! We Can Make Everyday Earth Day!
